**PROPOSED JUDGING SCHEDULE**

Judging starts both days at 8:00 am — Handlers' Meeting before each class.

*One RLF run will start each day, then RLF sheep must rest at least 30 minutes; remaining RLF dogs will run between other classes throughout the day.*

AFTER the first RLF run, one judge will do:

HTAD I, II, III ducks	Duck Arena
HTD III, II & I ducks	Duck Arena
JHD sheep & goats	Gravel Arena
HCT goats & sheep	Gravel Arena

Running concurrently under the other judge will be:

HTAD III, II & I sheep & goats	HTAD Arena
HTD III, II & I goats and sheep	Big Field
HRD III, II & I sheep	Entire Farm

Both Days: HTD-III (S/G) - Ribbon Pull - HTD-III (D) - Shed with 5 (3/2 split)

**AHBA Fees:** Pre-entry \$40.00 per run/per dog. Gate \$45.00. FEO \$25.00

**ENTRIES:** Pre-entries close Saturday, June 12<sup>th</sup>, 2010.

NOTE: Any changes made after the closing date will be subject to an additional \$5.00 administration fee

**TEST/TRIAL RULES:** Test/Trials are held in accordance with current AHBA rules posted at [www.ahba-herding.org](http://www.ahba-herding.org).

1. Dogs must be 6 months or older for AHBA HCT Tests and 9 months or older for AHBA JHD Tests and all Trial classes.
2. Bitches in season may run at the end of TESTS and at any time in TRIALS.
3. All HCT entries are required to be on AHBA's list of Accepted Herding Breeds. Mixes cannot enter HCT. ALL breeds and mixes may enter JHD and all Trial classes. Contact the Event Secretary if you have questions.

**NEW AHBA RULE - Effective June 1, 2010, no entry can be accepted without either a registration number or an AHBA Tracking Number** (note: you do not need both). Select your registration number, and use that consistently for all AHBA trials, also please be consistent in your dog's name on all entry forms to avoid any errors with your title progression. 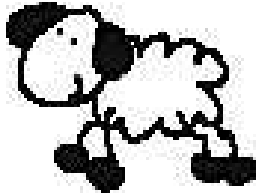
**FARM RULES:**

1. All dogs must be vaccinated for rabies as required by law, vaccinated for other communicable diseases as recommended by your veterinarian, and parasite free.
2. PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOGS.
3. All dogs must be on leash or crated except when working.
4. Extended Flexi-type leashes are not allowed on the farm. Keep your dog on a short leash.
5. There is very little shade at the farm. Plan accordingly. Water pools will be provided to cool your dog. (And bring yourself a chair!)
6. Spectators and their dogs should stay back at least 15 feet from the fence around any arena or field where a dog is working.
7. PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOGS.

## DIRECTIONS

Genoa City, WI is 9 miles south of Lake Geneva, WI at the WI/IL border.

**From the North:** Take US Hwy 12 south until Freeway ends; follow exit to the stop sign and turn right (west) on Hwy H. Follow Hwy H to the first stop sign, which will be in downtown Genoa City. Turn left (south) at the stop sign onto Hwy B. Go 1 block and follow Hwy B as it turns to the right (west). Continue 1½ miles to farm, which is on your right.

**From the South:** Take US Hwy 12 north until you cross the WI/IL state line. About ¼ mile further Hwy 12 splits off to the right to begin the freeway; Hwy H bears to the left, which will take you into Genoa City. Continue as above.

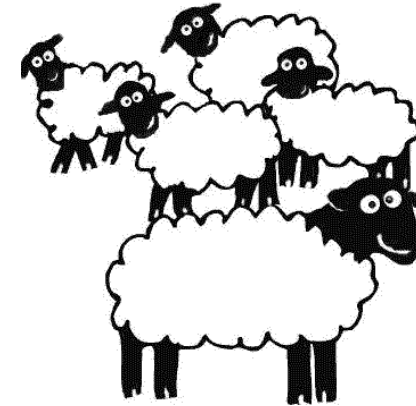

When completing the Entry Form, please make sure you select FEO (For Exhibition Only) for your Fun Run.

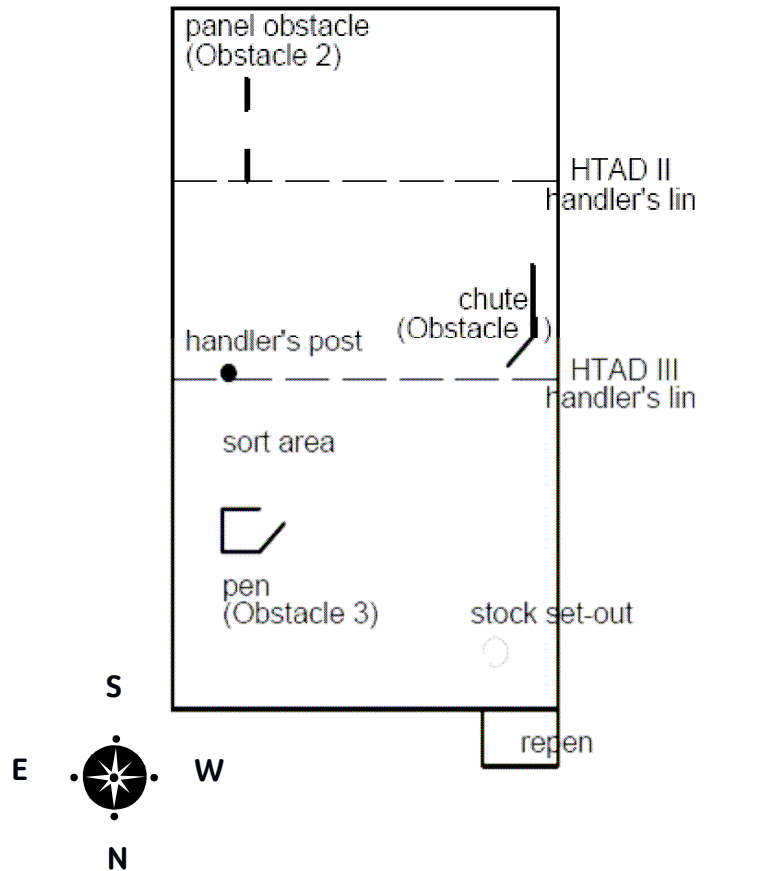

## HTAD Course #2

## HTAD (Sheep & Goats) Course #2



### COURSE #2



90/100 - 10 min. I & II; 12 min. III - 5 Animals  
Ties Determined by (1) gather/take-pen, (2) repen, (3) time

SAT - Take Pen; and at #6 - III will 3/2 Shed  
SUN - Gather; and at #6 - III will do a ribbon pull

### 1. Gather or Take-Pen

**Gather:** The stock are let out at the repen gate and allowed to settle. HTAD I handlers take the dog to a point approximately one-half the distance from the handler's post to the stock and leave the dog; the handler may move to approximately 15 ft. from the stock and send the dog to gather. HTAD II handlers leave the dog at the handler's post and move to a point approximately halfway between the post and the stock and send the dog to gather. HTAD III handlers and dogs stay at the handler's post, and the dog is sent from there to gather the stock. At all three levels the stock are brought to and around the handler's post, on the side between the post and the Y chute. The gather ends when the stock have gone just past the handler's post.

**Take-Pen:** HTAD III handlers must remain outside the pen while the dog brings out the stock. HTAD II handlers may enter the pen with the dog but should not move the stock themselves. HTAD I handlers may enter the pen and assist the dog in moving the stock. If the stock come out on their own volition without the handler or dog entering, there is no penalty. The stock are then taken to the point on the course where the handler's post would be located for the gather. Scoring for the take-pen ends when the stock have reached that point at which the handler's post would be located. The course then proceeds as indicated in the description.

### 2. Drive

The stock are taken **NORTH** between the **EAST** fence and the freestanding pen, then around the pen to a point just in front of the pen gate. Handlers at all levels may accompany the stock to this point. The stock are then driven to the Y chute. HTAD I handlers may accompany the dog and stock, fetching or driving or a combination of both. HTAD II handlers may accompany the stock and dog to a point halfway to the Y chute. HTAD III handlers must remain at the position in front of the pen while the stock are driven to the Y chute. The drive ends when the stock reach a point 10 ft. in front of the Y chute.

### 3. Obstacle 1

The stock are taken through the Y chute. HTAD II and III handlers remain at the designated location until the stock have cleared the Y chute. HTAD I handlers remain at the entrance of the Y chute until the stock have cleared it. Obstacle 1 ends when the stock have cleared the Y chute.

### 4. Obstacle 2

Upon the stock exiting the Y chute, HTAD I handlers may fetch or drive the stock through the freestanding panels, Obstacle 2 (none of the handlers may go through the panels). HTAD II handlers must stay on the post side of the handler's line (which runs across the width of the arena, even with the outside edge of the panel obstacle that is nearest the center of the arena) until the stock have cleared the panel obstacle. HTAD III handlers will remain behind a handler's line that runs the width of the arena even with the handler's post until the stock have cleared the panel obstacle. Once the stock have cleared the panel obstacle, the stock are turned to the left and taken to the pen; all handlers may take any position relative to the stock when going to the pen. Obstacle 2 ends when the stock have cleared the panels.

### 5. Obstacle 3

The stock are penned in the freestanding pen. Scoring for the pen gate is closed.

### 6. Sort

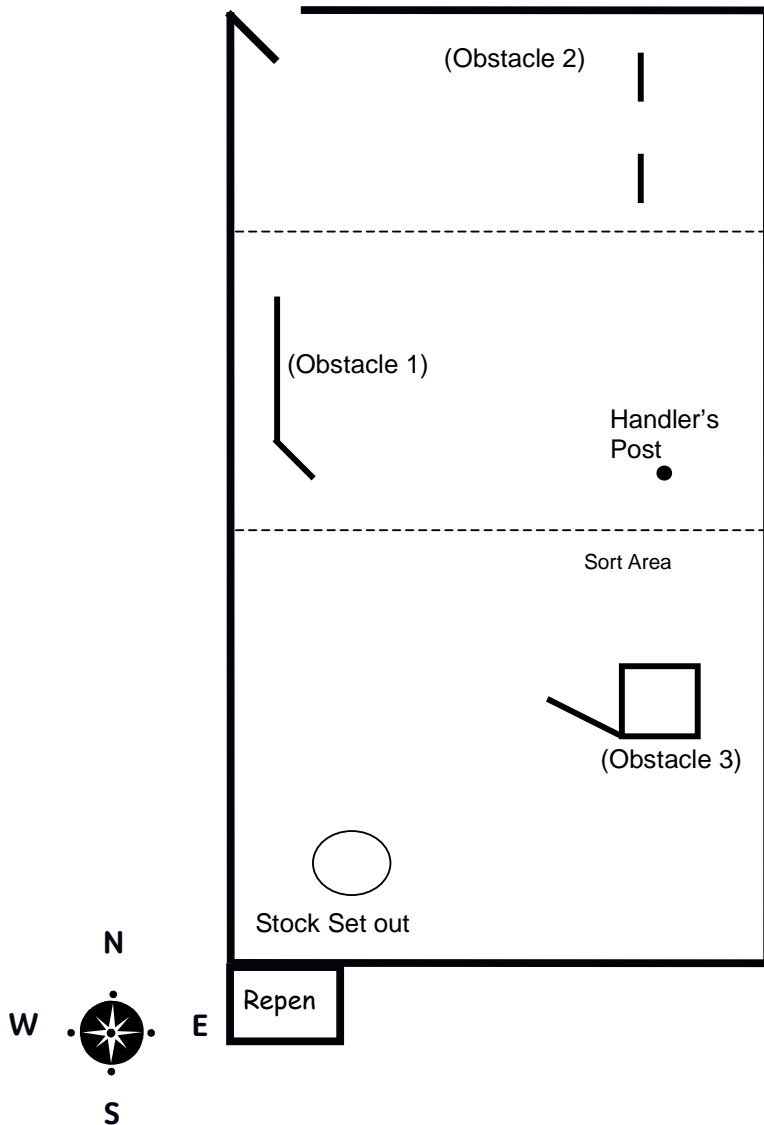
The animals are removed from the pen and taken to the sorting area. HTAD I and II handlers briefly hold the stock, then take them to the repen. For HTAD III handlers, the sort may be one of the following: (a) Gate sort of designated animals, (b) Ribbon-removal, or (c) Shed. The sort ends for HTAD I and II at the conclusion of the hold, and for HTAD III when the gate is closed on the sorted animals, or when the ribbon has been removed, or animals have been shed.

### 6. Repen

The stock are taken to the repen and held a short distance off the gate while it is opened, and then they are repenned. When a gate-sort has been used, the animals that had been left out in the arena are repenned. The run ends when the repen gate is closed.

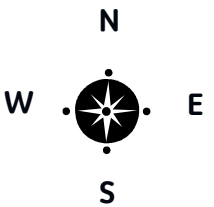
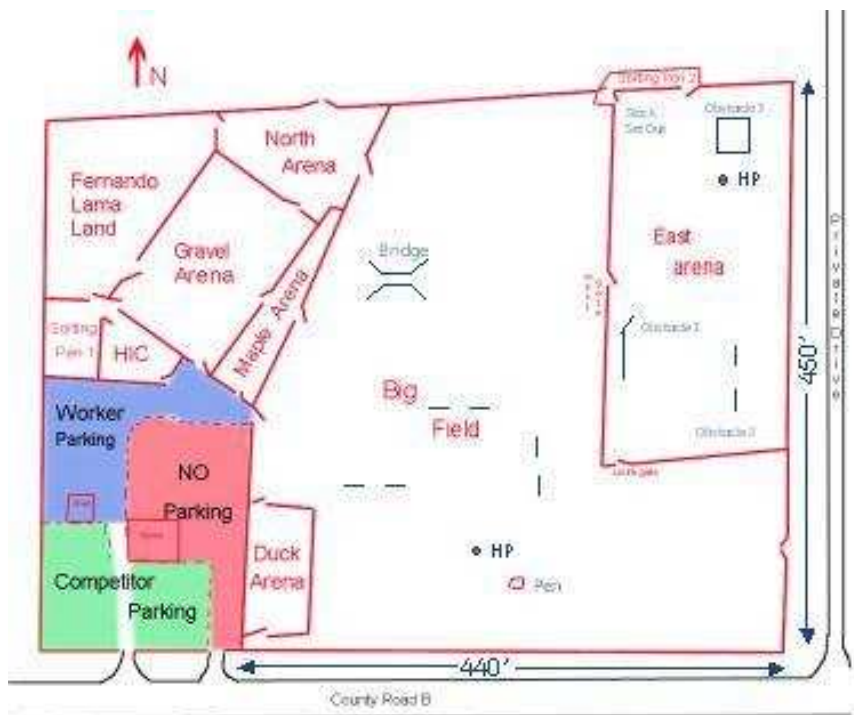

1. Gather. The stock are set out in the Arena. HTAD I handlers take the dog to a point approximately one-half the distance from the handler's post to the stock and leave the dog; the handler may move to approximately 15 ft. from the stock and send the dog to gather. HTAD II handlers leave the dog at the handler's post and move to a point approximately halfway between the post and the stock and send the dog to gather. HTAD III handlers and dogs stay at the handler's post, and the dog is sent from there to gather the stock. At all three levels the stock are brought to and around the handler's post, on the side between the post and the Y chute. The gather ends when the stock have gone just past the handler's post.
2. Drive. The stock are taken **SOUTH** between the **WEST** fence and the freestanding pen, then around the pen to a point just in front of the pen gate. Handlers at all levels may accompany the stock to this point. The stock are then driven to the Y chute. HTAD I handlers may accompany the dog and stock, fetching or driving or a combination of both. HTAD II handlers may accompany the stock and dog to a point halfway to the Y chute. HTAD III handlers must remain at the position in front of the pen while the stock are driven to the Y chute. The drive ends when the stock reach a point 10 ft. in front of the Y chute.
3. Obstacle 1. The stock are taken through the Y chute. HTAD II and III handlers remain at the designated location until the stock have cleared the Y chute. HTAD I handlers remain at the entrance of the Y chute until the stock have cleared it. Obstacle 1 ends when the stock have cleared the Y chute.

## HRD-II



Points

1. Dog is placed at handler's post. Handler may stand at the handler's post or  $\frac{1}{2}$  way between handler's post and fetch panels marked by white stake. Handler sends dog on outrun. After the dog is sent, Handler may move forward as far as the stake. 10
2. Dog is to fetch sheep through the fetch panels making a hard (dog's left, handler's right) turn and drive to east panels. Handler must stay at the stake during drive **TIEBREAKER (1)** 20
3. When the sheep have cleared the east gate, the handler may move back to the handler's post. Dog fetches sheep back to handler & make a clockwise turn around the handler's post. Dog must drive sheep through left (west) panel. Handler may walk BEHIND the dog during this drive. Handler may not walk through panel. 20
4. When sheep have cleared panel, handler & dog may wear/ drive sheep across the field through the east panel (handler may not walk through panel) to HTAD arena's south gate. 5
5. Handler must sort off 4 sheep into HTAD arena. 10
6. Handler & dog wear/drive remaining sheep to free standing pen & pen all sheep. (All sheep must be penned before handler can move on to next obstacle) **TIEBREAKER (2)** 10
7. Handler & dog take sheep out of freestanding pen, & take them over the bridge, from west to east. A straight-line path should be maintained between pen & bridge. Offline sheep will have points deducted. All sheep must cross bridge to continue. Handler must cross bridge after sheep have crossed. 10
8. Handler & dog wear/drive sheep to HTAD west arena gate & reopen them. 5

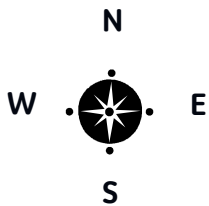
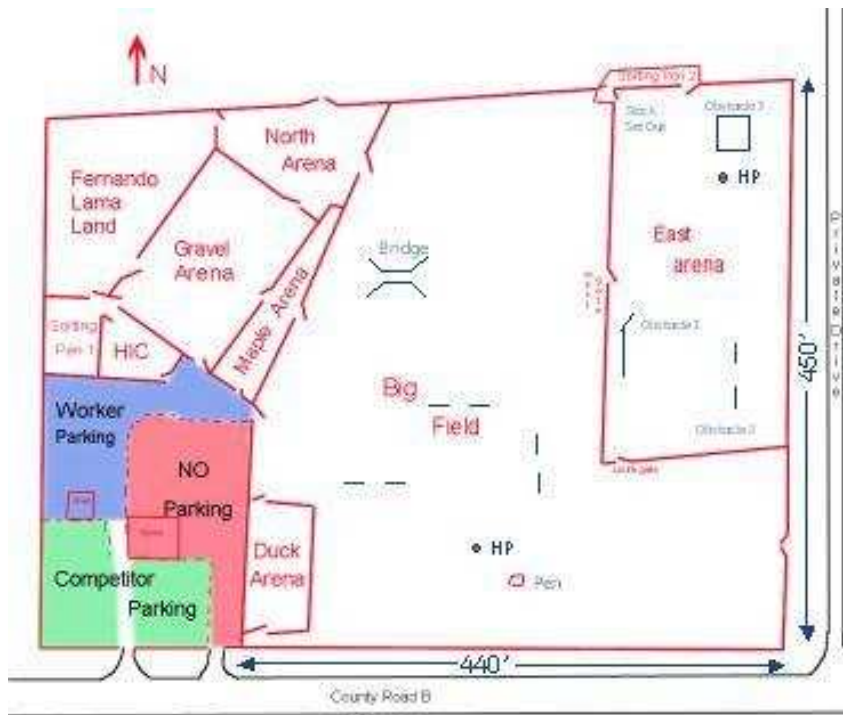
Points

1. Take all sheep out of sorting pen. 10
2. Sort sheep into Maple Arena leaving 3 sheep in Gravel Arena 10
3. Gather sheep in Maple Arena & move through small gate into large field. Judged on quiet & controlled movement of stock through small gate. **TIEBREAKER (1)**. Allow sheep to escape in the Big Field after exiting gate. Spotter will pick up sheep & spot them in the Big Field. 5
4. Handler & dog must go to bridge & do an outrun to re-gather sheep. 10
5. Take sheep over bridge. Handler may walk over the bridge after the sheep. All sheep must go over bridge. Deductions taken for each missed attempt. Handler cannot go on until this obstacle is completed. **TIEBREAKER (2)** 10
6. Drive up road. Handler must stay at bridge until dog turns sheep towards panel drive line. 15
7. Drive sheep through left & right panels. Handler may not walk through panels. Handler may walk up to red handler's post in center of field until sheep go through the west panel. Then handler may start walking towards the freestanding pen. 15
8. Wear sheep to freestanding pen, & pen. Judge will okay it when sheep are penned. Dog & handler must let sheep out of pen & dog must remain under control while sheep escape 10
9. Dog must do outrun from freestanding pen & wear them into HTAD Arena. 15

Handler and Owner hereby release AHBA, its officers, directors agents and members, including Shannon Wolfe, Magic's Legacy (its officers, agents and directors) and the owners of the site of the event, from any and all liability for any injury, loss or damage, of whatever kind or nature, whether to person or property which occurs directly or indirectly or associated with the herding event.
